Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students

Thank you for your interest in the ADEA Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander student scholarships. As part of our commitment to supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health professionals in undertaking the graduate certificate in diabetes education and management, and ultimately becoming CDEs, we are pleased to offer 2025 mid-year scholarships to eligible candidates.

To be considered for the scholarship, applicants must:

- identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- be accepted to an <u>ADEA-accredited University Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Management</u>
 <u>Program</u>
- have an appropriate underlying health profession: Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
 Health Practitioner, Medical Practitioner, Registered Nurse, Registered Midwife, Accredited
 Practising Dietitian, Accredited Exercise Physiologist, Registered Pharmacist, Registered
 Podiatrist, Registered Physiotherapist, or Registered Optometrist.

Applications must include:

- Personal Essay: We are looking for individuals who have a genuine passion for diabetes
 education and have demonstrated their commitment to the field through relevant
 experiences, such as volunteer work, research, or professional engagement. (200–500
 words.)
- Proof of Acceptance to an ADEA accredited university
 - ADEA | Postgraduate Certificates ADEA
- Letter of Recommendation: include a minimum of ONE letter of recommendation from an individual who can attest to your academic abilities, commitment to diabetes education and overall suitability for the program
- Proof of underlying profession
