Monday July 10

Professor Bu Yeap, Endocrinologist (WA)

Dr Bu Yeap (MBBS, FRACP, PhD) is Professor, School of Medicine, University of Western Australia and consultant endocrinologist, Department of Endocrinology and Diabetes, Fiona Stanley Hospital, Perth, WA. He has longstanding interests in the area of hormones and health outcomes during male ageing, particularly the interactions between hormones, diabetes and cardiovascular disease, and the clinical care of patients with endocrine disorders and diabetes. He has published extensively on the epidemiological associations of low testosterone with poorer health outcomes in older men, and in 2016 was first author on a national Position Statement regarding the management of male hypogonadism. He has more than 140 publications with >2,000 citations.



Tuesday July 11

Professor Joe Proietto AM, Endocrinologist (VIC)

Professor Joseph Proietto is an Endocrinologist specialising in Diabetes and Obesity. He is a world renowned investigator of the genetic and biochemical causes of obesity. Professor Proietto established the first obesity clinic in Victoria at the Royal Melbourne Hospital and is now Head of the Weight Control Clinic at Austin Health. He is a senior specialist at the Austin Health Endocrinology Clinic. He was the inaugural Sir Edward Dunlop Medical Research Foundation, Professor of Medicine, in the Department of Medicine Austin Health, University of Melbourne. He is a past President of the Australian and New Zealand Society Obesity Society (ANZOS) and was the Chair of the Program Organising Committee for the 10th International Congress of Obesity Sydney. He has been on the Council of the Australian Diabetes Society and has served on the Board of Diabetes Australia acting as Chairman of its Medical Educational and Scientific Council. He was Chairman of the National Association of Diabetes Centres.




Wednesday July 12

Dr Robert Shaw, Nephrologist (QLD)

Dr Robert Shaw completed the bulk of his renal training in South East Queensland, with a year back in his homeland New Zealand to further his training in home dialysis. He currently has a public appointment at the Tweed Hospital and clinical privileges at Pindara Private Hospital, John Flynn Private Hospital and Allamanda Private Hospital at the Gold Coast.

Rob's professional interests include home dialysis, hypertension and quality of life management in chronic kidney disease. Living on the Gold Coast has made him realise the importance of holidays for patients with end-stage kidney failure.

Professor Timothy Davis, Endocrinologist (WA)

Professor Timothy Davis is the Head of Unit, an endocrinologist, general physician and tropical medicine specialist at Fremantle Hospital in Western Australia, and Professor of Medicine at the University of WA. He has had research interests in diabetes since 1978. He is principal investigator of the Fremantle Diabetes Study, a large-scale prospective study of diabetes in a community-based cohort which has been in progress since 1993 and which has produced more than 90 published papers. Prof Davis has been awarded the prestigious Australian Diabetes Society's 2014 Kellion Award for his contribution to diabetes research.

Dr Kevin Lee. Dr Lee is a consultant Endocrinologist and Specialist Physician at Lifestyle Breakthrough. Aside from consulting from Lifestyle Breakthrough privately in Caulfield, Daylesford and Gisborne, he also works at Monash Medical Centre. To round off his extensive commitment to providing clients with the best care, Kevin remains heavily involved in research with Monash University on topics such as stress, weight management, diabetes and mindfulness.
