

## Start your career as a Credentialed Diabetes Educator in six steps

There are six steps to achieve your credentialling status with ADEA and become a **Credentialed Diabetes Educator (CDE)**.

To be eligible for the credentialling program, you must be a Registered Nurse, Registered Midwife, Accredited Practising Dietitian, Registered Medical Practitioner, Registered Pharmacist, Registered Podiatrist, Accredited Exercise Physiologist or a Registered Physiotherapist. There is also a credentialling pathway for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander health professionals.

### STUDY

Complete a Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Education and Management.

2

### REGISTER

Register for ADEA membership.

3

### PRACTICE

Complete 1000 hours of practice in diabetes education.

4

### MENTORING

Undertake six months of mentoring by an experienced CDE.

5

### CPD HOURS

Undertake 20 hours Continuing Professional Development (CPD) per year.

6

### REFeree REPORT

Provide a referee report from a mentor, a CDE you work with, your manager or supervisor.
