To be considered for the scholarship, applicants must:

- identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- be accepted to an [ADEA-accredited University Graduate Certificate in Diabetes Management Program](#)
- have an appropriate underlying health profession: Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioner, Medical Practitioner, Registered Nurse, Registered Midwife, Accredited Practising Dietitian, Accredited Exercise Physiologist, Registered Pharmacist, Registered Podiatrist, Registered Physiotherapist, or Registered Optometrist.

Applications must include:

- **Personal Essay:** We are looking for individuals who have a genuine passion for diabetes education and will use this degree to make a difference in diabetes care. (200 – 500 word count)
- **Proof of Acceptance to an ADEA accredited university**

- **Letter of Recommendation:** include a minimum of ONE letter of recommendation from an individual who can attest to your academic abilities, commitment to diabetes education and overall suitability for the program
- **Proof of underlying profession**
